About the pattern

This fun pattern is to make a Llama pillow. We love llamas they are fluffy, have funny faces and split on people they don't like!

The pillow design is suitable for kids and adults. You can place it in the couch, but it also works great as a floor cushion. If you plan to give it to a baby or toodler, we suggest you to embroider the eyes instead of using buttons as specified in this tutorial.

To give your Llama cushion a nice final touch you can add a few pom poms and tassels. You can attach them at one of the llama ear and make a few extra stitches to fix them properly on the pillow.

Fabric suggestions

We recommend you to use two differnts fabric: Beige fleece or jersey to make the face, and white faux sheepskin or faux fur fabric to make the cushion itself.

To sew the llama pillow you will need:

- > Fabric for the cushion body 3/4 yard x 45" (50 cm x1,15m)
- > Fabric for the face 20"x20" (50x50cm)
- > 2 black buttons of I "diameter (2.5cm)
- > Black embroidery thread
- > Beige and white thread
- > A bag of cushion filling
- > Some yarn to make pom poms and tassels

Printing the pattern

The pattern can be print on US letter sized paper.

Open the pattern in Adobe Reader. Before printing the files you will need to verify the scale setting on your printer. The pattern need to be printed as its true scale.

To do so, go into your print settings and look for the "page scaling" box. Then select "actual size", or "none", or "turn off page scaling".

Print only page I of the pattern and check than the large test square measure I in.x I in. or the smaller 2x2cm It really needs to be the exact measure, so if it's not right go back and check your print setting again.

Once the scaling is right, print the pattern.

Assembling

The pattern comes in 12 sheets, cut along the dotted lines. Place the pages following the printing plan and glue or tape the pages together.

The printable also include an envelope where you can keep your pattern and instructions for future use. Cut the front envelope following the lines and fold the 3 flaps on the dotted lines. Cut the envelope back, add some glue on the flaps to assemble both sheets.

let's start sewing

- I. Cut the pattern pieces and report on fabric:
 - >Draw the face shape two time on the beige fabric
 - >Draw the circle two time on the white fabric
- >Draw the ear shape, two time on the beige fabric and two time on the white fabric.

Leave a seam allowance of 5/8" (1.5cm) and cut the fabric shapes, you must end up with 8 pieces.





2. Report the mouth shape on one of the face fabric piece. Use a black embroidery thread to draw the llama nose and mouth. If you choose to embroider the eyes, instead of using buttons, you can do them too.





3. Place the two face shapes on top of each others, wrong side out. Pin and sew leaving an opening of a few inches to turn the face right side out.



4. Remove the pins and make small incisions all around the edge of the fabric. So that the rounded shapes are well defined once you turn your piece right side out.



5. Turn the piece right side out. Pin the opening and iron. Place the face on one of the white fabric circle. The llama face must be centered on the circle and you must leave a distance of more or less 4 inches (10 cm) from the circle lower part. Pin and sew as close as possible from the fabric face edge.



6. Stitch two black buttons to make the llama eyes. If the cushion is used by baby or toodler, it may be safer to embroider the eyes instead of using buttons. So you avoid any risk of suffocation if one of the button comes off.



7. Sew the llama ears. Take the four ear pieces and place one beige shape on top of one white shape, right side facing each others. Pin the edges together and sew leaving the ear base open. Repeat to make a second identical ear. Turns the pieces right side out and iron.



- 8. To make nice and straight ears you need to fold the ear edge to the center. Make a few hand stitches to hold the ear folded. Sew the ear edges together up to a little higher than half of the ear length.
- 9. Take the second white circle and place the ears on it. The circle right side must be up. The ears are facing up and pointing down. You can use the pattern to help you place them accurately. Remember that the ear edges must be align with the circle upper edge. Pin them with the circle fabric and make a few stitches next to the edge to attach the ears with the circle.



I O. Place the circle with the face on top of the circle with the ears, right sides facing each others. Be sure that the mouth is down and the ears are up. You don't want to end up with a llama who has ears on his chin. Pin all along the edges and sew leaving an opening to be able to turn right side out. Slow down when sewing around the ears as you have several layers of fabric and don't want to break the needle.







- II. Fill the cushion with the filling foam. Be sure to put enough foam as it tend to flatten with use. Once you are done filling it, fold the edges of the opening trough inside, pin and made a few hand stitches to close the pillow.
- I 2. Add a few pom poms and tassels, that can be homemade or purchased. You can hang them on one ear. To last, I will suggest to stitch them on the cushion.

And done! Enjoy your llama cushion!
